

HOMESTEAD PARK TREETRAIL

We have created a tree trail around the park to show off a range of some of our trees, some of which are rare. For those who take an interest in wanting to learn what certain trees are and what they look like, this a fun way to learn and get you out in the fresh air. This tree trail also works well alongside our Forest Schools project where local children learn about some of nature's giants from an early age, by knowing what they look like (size and shape), the textures of the leaves and varieties of scents and colours.

As soon as you come into the park from the car park area you see just a little minority of the range we have:

Himalayan Birch (Betula jacquemontii) with its striking white bark. Weeping Ash (Fraxinus excelsior pendula) with its graceful drooping branches and winged fruits and Copper Beech (Fagus sylvatica atropurpurea riversii) with its bristly fruits and leaves turning a deep purple in summer and brown in autumn.
